I've heard your coach say on many occasions, " you must work as hard when you haven't got the ball as you do when you have got the ball ". This will be crucial next week against Craigieburn and just might be the key to success. Working hard when you haven't got the ball creates turnovers as the pressure you apply to the opposition forces an error. Once you gain possession play a game of keepings off with them until you find an avenue of attack.
